Our full-time, dedicated EAL (English as an Additional Language) teacher is part of the SEN (Special Educational Needs) department and specialises in helping pupils with little or no English make accelerated progress in reading, writing, grammar, and spelling. This includes focused 1:1 or small group lessons, as well as tailored support to help pupils access the wider curriculum. Our aim is to ensure every child quickly develops the academic, conversational, and social language skills needed to be happy and successful across the school day.

How it works

- During the admissions process, the level of English of the child must be declared by the parents.
- For children joining Year 1 and above, an in-person or online meeting will take place for the School to determine their level of English.
- At the offer stage, the Admissions team will let you know if the offer is conditional on the EAL course.
